

Data Submission Guide changes for FY 2017

3/7/2016: **Client File: Fields 25 through 39 – Diagnosis Fields**

Beginning with Fiscal Year 2016, the formatting for the diagnosis fields was changed to accommodate ICD-10 codes. During Fiscal Year 2016, both ICD-9 and ICD-10 codes were allowed. Starting with Fiscal Year 2017 (July 1, 2016), only ICD-10 diagnoses will be accepted.

3/7/2016: **Event File: Insurance Type Code**

Insurance Type Code 02 (IMPACT Plus) has been deactivated effective with Fiscal Year 2017.

3/7/2016: **Event File: Special Program Indicator**

Instructions have changed for this field. Centers may now, if they choose, submit the General Special Program Indicator Code for each category in lieu of providing the more detailed codes.

Special Program Indicator Code 114 was renamed from “IMPACT children” to “Hi-Fidelity Wraparound children”.

A new code for Physical Health (HIPAA Code 900) was added in April 2016. It can be used for services dated as early as July 1, 2015.

3/7/2016: **Event File: DMHMRS Modifier 1 (Service Code)**

The following codes have been deactivated for services dated July 1, 2016 or later:

- 021 – Specialized Evaluation and Consultation (IFBSS)
- 022 – Intervention Services (IFBSS)
- 023 – Intervention Services – Overnight Care (IFBSS)

Former Code 003 (Assessment DUI/AI) has been broken down into two separate codes. Code 003 will no longer be accepted for services dated July 1, 2016 or later. The new allowable values are:

- 103 – Assessment – DUI
- 104 – Assessment – Alcohol Intoxication

The Unit of Service value for Code 090 (PASRR Specialized Services Intellectual Disabilities) has changed from “1 Service” to “15 minutes”. The code definition has been updated to reflect the new Unit of Service value.

Code 900 (Physical Health Services) was added in April 2016. It can be used for services dated as early as July 1, 2015.

Definitions were updated in May 2016 for crisis service codes 138 (Residential Crisis Stabilization – Adults) and 139 (Residential Crisis Stabilization – Children). For details, see Pages AE-10 and AE-11 in Appendix E.

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
