There were some great workshops, the problem we had was alot of the workshops were at the same time, so we missed out on some awesome information. There were some great resources for our families to use. Great vendors as well full of information to share with our families. Most of the workshops were

standing room only, which was great. Our discussion regarding the workshops were this should be clear that those are the type of workshops our parent leaders/peer support would like to see more of. They also liked that some of the workshops were open more than once, if you missed it then you can try to catch the next one later in the day. Also a discussion on some of the parent/youth panels, they felt this was a great opportunity for professionals to talk to

our parents/youth. That their voices are important. Some of the parents liked the fact that you had to scan in and out, that everyone that was there wanted to be there. Some didn't like it, they stated that sometimes you may need to leave early and you would not get credit for being there. But it seemed everyone enjoyed the conference. Some stated they could not wait to see what it will be next year, But if they could change one thing it would be, that at least one

parent and one youth should be sitting at the table for the strategies on the workshops. When the discussions start that their voices should be there. There were several parent leaders/PSS that have attended the SOC for the last few years and stated that it keeps getting better every year.

On June 10, our joint meeting was held in conjunction with the SOC. We discussed the SOC and evaluated it thru our family advisory, and they felt it was a success. We did have a few new parent leaders/PSS this year in attendance, they stated that it was a great opportunity for us to receive information and workshops that they may not have had if they hadn't attended.

We offered a self care workshop for our parents, we discussed how important it is to take care of our selves so we can be all we can be for our families that we work with.

I think the best part was when we teamed up and played Family Fued. It was great to just have a good time and network with

each other.

There was a discussion on how we talk about wanting to change things or what may be needed for us to move forward, we do a lot of talk but we decided now is the time to put legs on those words and get things moving forward.

We would like to see extra support for our PSS/parent leaders. There should be special trainings for CMHC to understand what Family and Youth Peer Support looks like. They struggle with not understanding how this looks different from Adult Peer Support. The Family Peer Support and Youth Peer Support is growing and we would like to see it keep growing. Our hopes is that every Region in Ky will hire at least one Youth and Family Peer Support

Specialist.
