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	<p>providers to the RIACs.</p> <p>Summary of issue brought forward by Bluegrass South: “Emergency placement” options have diminished and subsequently eliminates the option of a short term placement to allow a safe placement and separation during a crisis. The RIAC asks if some of the reinvestment money can go toward emergency shelter resources or if agreements could be made with the therapeutic foster care providers to designate a home or two for these types of situations.</p> <p>Response from SIAC: Reinvestment money has not yet been realized. Council requested more information, as it is not clear the origin of the problem. Needs to be collaborative problem-solving amongst SIAC agencies. Council suggested a few people work together to gather a list of barriers. It was suggested that DCBS partner with DJJ for one of the October agenda items re: placement barriers. Council recommended making this a priority: discuss access and building capacity.</p> <p>Summary of issue brought forward by Bluegrass East: Dan Hemlock, LRC, introduced issue of reduced referrals to day treatment program. Currently court is source of referrals to day treatment. Would like policy changed so that day treatment can be accessed without a court order.</p> <p>Response from SIAC: A change in process would require a legislative change. SIAC would like RIAC to look at graduated responses (vs sanctions). How does this fit as a graduated response? How would day treatment look as a graduated response, specifically if it was a referral from the FAIR Team? Audience member brought up that this may be an issue with KECSAC funding, so Department of Education would need to be involved in this.</p>	<p>http://dbhdid.ky.gov/dbh/siac-summaries.aspx. Dr. Shepherd discussed the connection to the System of Care (SOC). The Plan of Safe Care needs to be supported by the SOC. Dr. Shepherd requested assistance from SIAC and RIACs to help build a stronger SOC.
