Continuous Quality Improvement Committee

Co-Chairs: Rachel Bingham (AOC) & Dr. Greg Finkbonner (DJJ)

The Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) committee is responsible for conducting data analysis to ensure the system of care is systematically and intentionally improving services and increasing positive outcomes for the youth and families they serve. Activities may include, but are not limited to, reviewing and analyzing a quarterly data dashboard and conducting analysis of disparities and disproportionate minority contact in the system of care.

Service Array Committee

Chair: Melissa Goins (FRYSC)

The Service Array (SA) committee is responsible for identifying service supports and practice models to achieve the shared outcomes of the system of care. Activities may include, but are not limited to, refining the statewide service array continuum, exploring the wider adoption of evidence-based practices, and exploring service usage across the state.

System Structure & Governance Committee

Chair: Dr. John Sivley (Lifeskills)

The System Structure & Governance (SS&G) Committee (which will be absorbing the former Finance & Resource committee) is responsible for identifying the administrative and/or system infrastructure needed to support the system of care, and for developing a long-term governance structure for the children's system of care. Activities may include, but are not limited to, drafting legislation and regulations, reviewing SIAC policies and procedures, supporting the evolution of the Regional Interagency Councils and reviewing and acting on the results of the upcoming financial mapping process.

Training & Technical Assistance Committee

Co-Chairs: Kristie Stutler (DJJ) & Brittany Roberts (Kentucky Partnership for Families and Children)

The Training & Technical Assistance (T&TA) Committee is responsible for supporting the system of care with practical or specialized knowledge through information sharing, training opportunities, and specific implementation tools. Activities may include, but are not limited to, supporting the System of Care Academy planning and implementation, researching best practices, developing tip sheets or guidance documents, and leveraging existing training and technical assistance opportunities for system of care partners.
