## CONFIDENTIALITY AGREEMENT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS OR BEHAVIOR INTERVENTION COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Members of both the Human Rights Committee (HRC) and the Behavior Intervention Committee (BIC) must sign confidentiality agreements and function in accordance with the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). Confidentiality means the data and information presented and discussed during the committee meetings is not shared with individuals not on the committee or not authorized to have the information.

All information being reviewed by the committee will be held in the strictest confidence and will be handled, stored or processed in a secure and confidential manner. All committee members will be held accountable for adhering to the confidentiality policy as well as state and federal confidentiality laws. Unauthorized disclosure is strictly prohibited and a violation could result in removal from the committee and possible legal action.

Committee members will acknowledge that in reviewing information presented to the committee for review, they are fully bound by state and federal laws regarding the confidentiality of individual information and will observe and respect individual rights.
